Inventive science models hurtle through the air.

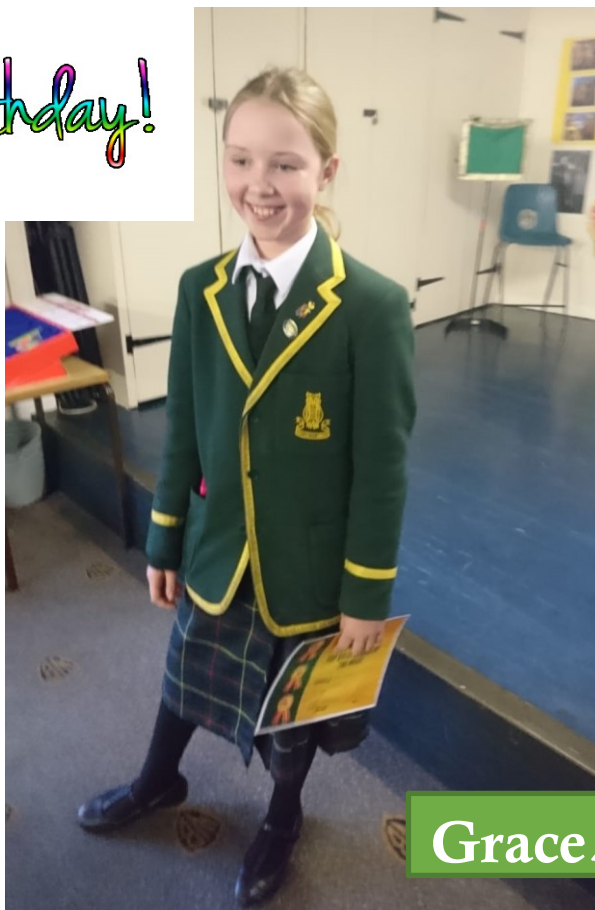
Leaders hold a strong vision for our future.
